Trail Monitoring Volunteer

When conducting a trail survey your primary goal will be to record invasive species location using a GPS and WRISCs Volunteer Mapping Form, which will be provided or found on our website (www.wrisc.org). You will also record the estimated density and area on this form, in addition to any other notes.

WRISC will use the information recorded and report it to an online database called the Midwest Invasive Species Information Network (MISIN). The MISIN app and website have great descriptions in helping identify the invasive species you will be looking for.

* It is highly recommended that the MISIN app be downloaded to help assist in monitoring.
